

Our Labyrinth



As part of the 2010 renovation project a labyrinth was laid in 2011. The labyrinth is located directly in front of the main doors of the church. It is 43 feet in diameter with 8 circuits. Four benches are placed on the perimeter of

the labyrinth. A labyrinth combines the imagery of a circle and a spiral. A circle is infinite that God's love and a spiral draws us deeper into our relationship with God. A labyrinth is often called a walking meditation. A labyrinth is not a maze, you cannot 'get lost' in the labyrinth, when you reach the centre you then walk out and the entrance becomes the exit.
