September 15 TOP HAT (1935) It's Fred Astaire and Ginger Rogers in their most popular film as they dance 'Cheek to Cheek' to the top-tapping tunes of Irving Berlin.



September 29 FOUR FROM THE GOLDEN AGE OF TELEVISION Four handpicked episodes from the Golden Age of TV comedy with Jack Benny, Jackie Gleason, Vivian Vance, Lucille Ball and more! A great intro to these amazing performers!

October 13 DIAL 'M' FOR MURDER (1954) Alfred Hitchcock's famous thriller about an unsuspecting wife (Grace Kelly) and the actions of her murderous, no-good husband. With Ray Milland and Robert Cummings.



October 27 UNFAITHFULLY YOURS (1948) Preston Sturges' dark and hilarious screwball comedy about an orchestra conductor (Rex Harrison) who believes that his wife (Linda Darnell) has been unfaithful and decides what to do about it during a concert.

November 10 THE GREAT ESCAPE (1963) This WWII classic true story of a daring escape from a German POW camp: an action packed, funny, suspenseful and exciting blockbuster film with a great cast: Steve McQueen, James Garner, Richard Attenborough, James Coburn and Charles Bronson. ***Please note: length of film is 172min and we will start at 1:00pm plus an intermission.*



November 24 RANDOM HARVEST (1942) A beautifully mounted, and yet mysterious love story about amnesiac man (Ronald Coleman) and the lonely woman (Greer Garson) who loves him in the years following World War I.

December 8 THE BELLS OF ST. MARY'S (1946) It's a clash of wills as Mother Superior Ingrid Bergman and parish priest Bing Crosby go head to head in this happy Catholic comedy, Leo McCarey's sequel to *Going My Way*.



December 22 A CHRISTMAS CAROL (1951) The definitive version of Charles Dickens' holiday story about Ebenezer Scrooge as he's visited by three spirits who show him the true meaning of Christmas; starring the wonderful Alastair Sim in the ultimate screen portrayal of everybody's favorite miser.
